<b>1/091018</b>	<b>Apologies for Absence and Approvals</b>
	Cllrs Kevin Griggs, Martin Redbond, Bryan Marks, Steve Brock and Alex Harrison were present. Cllr Beverley Thomas had sent her apologies and her absence was approved. Cllr Harrison advised she would have to leave early. County Cllr John Field was also present.
<b>2/091018</b>	<b>Declarations of Interest and Requests for Dispensation</b>
	None.
<b>3/091018</b>	<b>To invite public discussion on items on the agenda</b>
	No member of the public was present.
<b>4/091018</b>	<b>To review and confirm the costed Highways proposal for parking restrictions on Ashbocking Road outside Henley Primary School</b>
	After discussion it was agreed to ask Cllr Field to authorize Highways to proceed with the design and legal work required to install single yellow lines on each side of Ashbocking Road outside the school. Space will be allowed for three cars to stop and drop off/collect but otherwise parking will be legally restricted between the hours of 8.30-9.30am and 2.30-4.30pm. This project has the full support of the school. This stage of the work will cost £5,639.04 (approx.) which will come from the County Councillor's budget. It was agreed the Parish Council will pay the cost of the implementation (approx. £1,500). It is not known when

	the work will be carried out.
<b>5/091018</b>	<b>To consider a resident's complaint about bus and coach congestion in the morning at Fiveways Crossroads</b>
	The Norse coach which runs to Farlingaye School each morning (and back in the afternoon) stops on Ashbocking Road very close to the Fiveways crossroads, causing congestion and potential risk to traffic and pedestrians. It was agreed the Clerk will write to Norse and to Farlingaye requesting that the coach stop further along the road, roughly opposite the point in the Churchyard where the access track to the outside tap is situated.
<b>6/091018</b>	<b>Urgent matters to be brought to the attention of the Parish Council</b>
	The Parish Council thanked Cllr Field for his support on the school parking problem, and also for the grant which has enabled the Bowls Club to purchase specialist mat-laying equipment. The next scheduled meeting of the Parish Council is on Tuesday November 13 at 7.30pm in the Community Centre.
