Whitehouse

There have been two incidents where we have recorded two attempted robberies. One person has been arrested for one of these offences and they are currently on police bail. We have also recorded three crimes where vehicles have been broken into. Please remember to remove all valuable items from your vehicles. The SNT has also assisted a housing provider in evicting a tenant from an address where drug dealing was known to be taking place.

Whitton

There has been one house burglary and three attempted house burglaries reported in May. Please remember with the warm weather coming not to leave your windows and doors open. Two sheds have also been broken into. We have recorded nine crimes where vehicles have been broken into. Never leave valuable items in your vehicles. There has also been one incident where a motor bike was stolen.

Castle Hill

We have recorded 11 theft from motor vehicles, some of these have happened as a result of people leaving their vehicles unlocked. Please remember to lock your vehicles and double check if needs be. Some of these incidents are a result of Catalytic Converters being stolen. Unfortunately no persons have been identified as being responsible, so if you do see any suspicious activity please contact the police straight away. Bridge

A drugs warrant was executed at an address in Turin Street, Ipswich resulting in two being arrested. Police are investigating two house burglaries and three shed breaks. Please remember to use www.immobilise.com to record your property which assists police returning it to you, should it be stolen.

Gipping

We have worked with Ipswich Borough Council to reduce the number of discarded drug paraphernalia in Alderman Rec and increased our patrols during the half term fun fair. A Dispersal Order was used at key times to remove potential trouble makers from the area, which has led to a reduction in criminal activity compared with the past few years. Police presence will be maintained during the summer holidays.

Enquiries are on going in to four theft from motor vehicles and three house burglaries. There has been a rise in theft of pedal cycles in this area during May 2016. Please remember to always lock your bike and contact us if you would like your bike security marked, it's free!

Stoke Park

Police executed a search warrant at an address in Peterhouse Close, Ipswich and recovered 42 bags of stolen items. Enquiries are ongoing to return the property to the rightful owners and gather evidence to prosecute those involved.

Crime levels remain stable and there are no series or spikes in crime types across this area.

Sprites Ward

Police acted on community intelligence and executed a drugs warrant at an address in Kingfisher Avenue, Ipswich. One person was arrested after a quantity of cannabis and cash was recovered.


There have been a few reports of a male exposing himself to females in Ellenbrook Green during the evening hours. He has been described as a white male, 30 to 40 years old, 5'6ish tall, big build, white shirt with collar, coat or jacket which was a dark colour, glasses (reading) and wearing a hat.
